**The Global Film Initiative** is an international arts organization based in the United States. Established in 2002 to fund and to support the growth of global filmmaking communities, the Initiative showcases compelling stories from around the world through an innovative blend of exhibition, distribution and education.

The **Exhibition Program** presents films from the Initiative's signature world cinema series, Global Lens, in more than fifty locations every year, offering unique cultural perspectives to diverse audiences throughout the U.S. and Canada. Exhibition partners include film festivals and theaters, cultural institutions, libraries, universities and community centers.

The **Distribution Program** showcases the work of Global Lens' talented filmmakers through dynamic commercial partnerships and traditional film distribution channels such as home video, television, airline and online markets. A portion of revenues received from distribution and exhibition are reinvested in the Granting Program; the balance is paid to filmmakers as royalties, in support of new and future projects.

The **Granting Program** awards fifteen to twenty grants of up to \$10,000 each, every year, to filmmakers whose work offers insightful interpretations of the human experience. Grants are funded by revenue earned from Global Lens and are used to subsidize production in the recipient's country of origin, promoting the development of local film industries and new filmmaking talent.

The **Education Program** sponsors screening programs in high schools and universities, as well as film-based library initiatives and professional development opportunities for students. In order to promote a deeper understanding of each film and its cross-cultural themes, the program produces original educational discussion guides, which include cultural histories, director's statements and discussion questions: www.qlobalfilm.org/education.
